Our Work as the QIN-QIO



Staff IPC Training Requirements at a Glance

Important Core Components to Include in Infection Control Training for Staff

- **F726- §483.35 Nursing Services:** The facility must have sufficient nursing staff with the appropriate competencies and skill sets to provide nursing and related services to assure resident safety.
- F726 §483.35(a)(3) Proficiency of nurse aides: The facility must ensure that nurse aides are able to demonstrate competency in skills and techniques necessary to care for residents' needs, as identified through resident assessments, and described in the plan of care.
- F945 §483.95(e) Infection control: A facility must include as part of its infection prevention and control program mandatory training that includes the written standards, policies and procedures for the program as described at §483.30 (a)(2). (Refer to F880)
- F947 483.95(g) Required in-service training for nurse aides. Changes to the facility's resident population, the facility's physical environment, staff turnover and modifications to the facility assessment may necessitate ongoing revisions to the facility's training program. There should be a process in place to track staff participation in and understanding of the required training.

Principles of Adult Learning

 - Learning from experience
 - Readiness to learn
 - Immediate applications
 - Internally motivated
 - Need to know





Game-based learning and Gamification

Game-based Learning:

 An instructional method where students learn specific skills or knowledge from playing an actual game. This type of learning takes educational content and transforms it into a game that students can play.

Gamification:

• Incorporates game elements such as point systems, leaderboards, badges and other game-related features into "traditional" learning activities or a non-game context to enhance content comprehension, promote better retention of information, increase engagement and motivation.





How Can Incorporating Games/Gamification into Learning Benefit Your Training?

- Increased engagement
- Promote creative thinking
- Enhance the ability to think in a critical way
- Helps with retention
- Logic, ability to problem solve, think quickly





Effective Game Strategies

Tell a Compelling Story

Use a narrative that reflects real-life challenges and scenarios that staff face.

Provide Immediate Feedback

Help participants understand what they are doing right or wrong immediately.

Design an Objective-Centered Game

• Every element of the game drives toward specific objectives and have a clear purpose and outcome that aligns with the organizational goals.

Make it Challenging

 Make the game appropriately difficult to keep participants engaged but not so tough they become discouraged. Challenges should cover different skills and knowledge areas.


